During COVID restrictions activity packets will be left on the family's doorstep and visits can be done virtually or through phone calls. All participating families will be provided the opportunity to borrow a Chromebook laptop during their entire involvement in the program.

Group connections occur approximately twice a month and are an opportunity for families to socialize with other families in the program during fun and family engaging activities in our playroom, the community, as well as virtually. Participation in group connections are not required to be in the program.
